 - e. Spike in failure to return over the summer.
 - f. ARPA renovations are almost complete.
 - g. Home-detention has started with a new GPS vendor in hopes to save money.
 - h. Field investigators were difficult to hire, but are both on board and full time now.
 - i. Substantial budget increase requested of the County Council and will be presented on August 17, 2023.
 - j. Tia Baker accepted into the DOC Leadership Program and graduated the program. Award presented.
 - k. Received a favorable report from the Department of Labor.

 - c. Carl Chambers explained that there is a significant reduction in false location alerts from Q1 to Q2 and should be even lesser in Q3 and Q4.
 - d. Andrew Hanna inquired about current process if an individual is actually running.
 - i. Carl Chambers and David Kane explained the types of alerts, and automated call from call center, and victim notification.
 - e. David, Carl and/or Betsy will arrange a meeting for Jake from Total Court Services to present as to false location alerts.
